Not turning the clocks back by staying in summer time or winter time with the purpose of using daylight better may not be efficient at first. Students and people who begin working in early hours complain about this timing stating that they still feel like as if they still need to sleep since the sun sets after they wake up. This is because of a hormone in our body called melatonin and directly related with this disturbance. Melatonin is released only in dark environment, which basically means at nights. Therefore, sleeping between 21.00 and 05.00 is assumed to be the ideal period; between 02.00 and 04.00, it reaches its maximum level. It makes easier for us to sleep and sets out body time. Now, the warnings appearing at 21.30 every night on Turkish television channels and advising children to sleep seem more comprehensible. Not only children, but also adults need sleeping in these specific hours because with developing technology we spend 2/3 of our time using machines powered by electricity and spread light which hinders the production of melatonin as much as daylight does. Our body prepares itself for sleep with the sunset; but we retard our bedtime by working at home under a desk lamp, watching television, and the most common, idle around with smart phones, even in bed. First, we harm our eyes, secondly our sleeping pattern, then our whole body makes it regular and causes even cancer, diabetes, cardiovascular diseases and mental disorders, particularly depression. Unplugging all electronic devices at evenings or adjusting their brightness according to your environment at nights and fastening sleeping time are little but very effective precautions in long term.

Suprematist movement in art began with Russian painter and art theoretician Kazimir Malevich, the founder, in early 20th century. The name takes its roots from Latin word *suprema* or *supra* meaning “the topmost”. Basic geometric forms; such as circles, squares, rectangles, and limited range of colors, generally black and white, are primary elements of this abstract and nihilist concept. Having begun his career by depicting agricultural laborers on canvas, Malevich professionally involved in art by working as a technical painter at a railroad company in his youth. In early 1900s, he was attracted by mystical sides of quantitative sciences. Then he returned painting, which would pave the way to the birth of Supremacism, by drawing pictures of three different books and designing costumes and décor of an opera, *Victory Over the Sun* in 1913. Those are assumed to be pioneering steps taken from Futurism to Supremacism. Malevich continued his art by attending an exhibition The Last Futurist Exhibition O.10 which consisted of 35 paintings including other artists'. *White on White*, *Supremus: 58*, *Black Circle* which is displayed at St. Petersburg State Russian Museum and famous *Black Square* are the most recognized works of Malevich, who thinks that shapes are more meaningful than objects.

It's important because GMO, the process of re-doubling a characteristic to a plant which it does not have naturally, is directly related to nutrition, our basic need.
